Applicants must be enrolled in an accredited college, university, or law school and intend to pursue a career in juvenile justice. The award is contingent on the recipient's attendance in a program of study at an accredited college, university, or law school in the next academic year.

Additional material to be submitted with this application (your application will not be complete without this material):

- 1. <u>Transcript.</u> The application MUST be accompanied by a transcript from a college, university or law school in which the student is currently enrolled.
- 2. <u>Essay</u>. A five hundred (500) word essay describing the applicant's interest in juvenile justice and career goals.
 - 3. Resume. A resume describing the applicant's work experience.
- 4. <u>Letters of Recommendation</u>. Two letters of recommendations from persons unrelated to the applicant.

An oral interview may be required.
